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**PETILLANT NATUREL**

Pétillant naturel is the oldest method of making sparkling wine. It is also known as the method ancestral or ancestral method. This winemaking technique involves bottling wine that is still fermenting to trap carbon dioxide gas in the bottle, creating a gentle carbonation. Pet-nat wines (as they are called) are becoming more popular as part of the general trend toward natural wine.

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**CHARMAT METHOD**

The second fermentation takes place in a pressurized tank, rather than in a bottle, decreasing lees contact and producing larger, coarser bubbles. The wine is filtered under pressure and bottled. Also known as the bulk process or tank method. Expect light, less complex flavours.

## TRADITIONAL METHOD

The labour-intensive process whereby wine undergoes a secondary fermentation inside the bottle, creating bubbles. All Champagne and most high-quality sparkling wine is made by this process. This process gives flavours of bread dough and toast and makes the wine rich and creamy.

### Franciacorta DOCG

Franciacorta refers not only to a specific wine appellation within Brescia, Lombardia, but also to Italy's highest quality sparkling wine. Given a DOCG status, the area where the grapes are grown is on the hills located between the southern shore of Lago d'Iseo and the city of Brescia.

### Champagne AOC

This is traditional method sparkling at its best, with a combination of centuries of technique experience, climate and the chalkiest terroir. These wines are French sparkling perfection. The Champagne region of France is less than 100 miles east of Paris and is made up of the Côtes de Blanc, the Montagne de Reims, the Grande Valle, the Coteaux sud d'Épernay and Côtes des Bar.

## GEWURZTRAMINER

“Gewurz” is German for spice. This is a slightly pigmented, aromatic grape that ripens late with high sugar level. Look for aromas of ginger, rose and lychee in the glass

## PINOT GRIGIO / PINOT GRIS

The variety is a white mutation of the Pinot Noir grape, which came from Burgundy, but the spiritual home of Pinot Gris is in north-eastern France’s Alsace region, with Pinot Grigio’s being north-east Italy. In Italy is usually a straightforward, dry and often simple wine.

## ARNEIS

Arneis is a white wine grape variety originating from Piemonte. It is found in the Roero DOCG, northwest of Alba. It is a crisp and floral varietal, with aromas and flavours of white flower and stone fruit.

## PINOT BIANCO

The grape Pinot Bianco (Pinot Blanc) comes from genetic mutations of Pinot Noir. It is widely cultivated around the world but produces the best example in Trentino Alto Adige region. Those wine are extremely elegant and offer a combination of creamy and crisp, dry and mineral driven.

## TIMORASSO

Timorasso is an ancient grape variety from Piemonte that was on the verge of extinction in the 1980s. It was carefully revived by Walter Massa. Timorasso is native to the Colli Tortonesi region of southeast Piemonte. It has high acidity, and is aromatic and mineral-driven.

## ERBALUCE

## FRIULIANO & Blends

Friulano is a grape variety most famous for its role in the white wines of Friuli, northeast of Italy. These wines, usually varietal, are lively and fruit-driven with notes of citrus and almond, and often a touch of minerality.

### **RIBOLLA GIALLA & Blends**

Ribolla Gialla is a white wine grape variety that is widely planted in the northeastern Italian province of Friuli. It can be found in neighboring Slovenia, where it is known as Rebula. The wines are often characterised by their firm acidity, peach, citrus, and apple notes, and a faint floral aromatic profile.

It is known for crisp wine with very good acidity and citrus fruit. It is usually associated with San Gimignano, one of the Toscana’s most distinctive and best-preserved medieval hilltop town. In 1966, Vernaccia di San Gimignano was the first to receive the DOC status, due to historic reputation.

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## VERMENTINO & PIGATO

The origins of this variety are uncertain. Like many other Sardinian grape varieties, it could have been introduced by the Spanish between the fourteenth and seventeenth century. Today it grows in various locations around the western Mediterranean: northwestern Italy, Toscana, Sardegna and southern France. What's exciting about Vermentino is it can be deliciously complex in taste in similar style to Sauvignon Blanc. Pigato is genetically identical to Vermentino; they have adapted differently to the Ligurian terroir and produce wines with a distinct character.

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## SAGRANTINO

Sagrantino is Umbria's most distinctive grape, an ancient grape native to the area around Montefalco. The origin of the name derives from "sagra" which might refer to religious celebration or local country festivals. The grape has high level of polyphenols, therefore it has very high tannins. Indeed, it is considered one of the Italy's most tannic wines. Those wine are deep in colour with intense of black fruit.

## **CORVINA, MOLINARA, RONDINELLA & Blends**

The variety also lends itself well to the *appassimento* process of air-drying grapes, used to make the famous Amarone wine.

## **NERO D’AVOLA**

Nero d’Avola is the most important and widely planted red wine grape variety in Sicilia. Vast volumes of it are produced on the island every year, and have been for centuries. Nero D’Avola typically has high tannins, medium acidity and a strong body.

## ROSSESE
